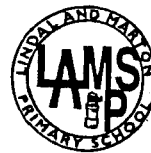


# Lindal and Marton Primary School

## Home-School Agreement



<b>Ethos</b>	<p>There is an expectation that everyone involved with the school including children, staff, parents, and governors, will strive to achieve the highest appropriate standards.</p> <p>The governors and staff of the school, with the support of parents and children, will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Secure the long term future of the school</li> <li>• Provide for each child a happy and caring environment in which each child is encouraged to develop to the best of their ability</li> </ul>	
<b>Standard of Education</b>	<p>The school will endeavour to enable children of all abilities to achieve their full, individual potential, with reference to the required national standards.</p> <p>Wherever possible, the school will endeavour to exceed the national standards.</p>	<p>Parents are asked to support the school's efforts to reach and exceed national standards, and to fulfil the potential of each child.</p>
<b>School Rules</b>	<p>The school has a set of rules, which parents can view at any time.</p>	<p>Parents are asked to support the school rules.</p>
<b>Attendance</b>	<p>If the school has not heard from parents of an absent child, they will attempt to contact them at the earliest opportunity to ensure that the absence is accounted for, and that the child is in a safe place. The school is legally obliged to track pupil attendance.</p>	<p>Children are expected to attend school regularly and punctually. Parents are legally responsible for their child(ren)'s good attendance.</p> <p>If your child cannot attend school on a given day, please contact the school as soon as possible.</p> <p>If you need to take your child on holiday during term time, please inform the school.</p>
<b>Discipline and Behaviour</b>	<p>The school aims:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To be firm but fair, constant and consistent</li> <li>• To encourage and reward good behaviour</li> <li>• To use reasoning to achieve awareness and appreciation of unacceptable behaviour</li> <li>• To use withdrawal of privileges as a means of showing that bad behaviour is not condoned</li> </ul>	<p>Parents are asked to support the school in any disciplinary measures that need to be taken, and in any action taken to promote positive behaviour.</p> <p>The school has a policy on Promoting Positive Behaviour. Parents are welcome to view this at any time.</p>
<b>Uniform</b>	<p>The school has a uniform, which is actively encouraged, but which is not compulsory.</p>	<p>Parents are asked to support the wearing of school uniform.</p>
<b>Homework</b>	<p>The school has a Homework Policy. Homework is set individually to enable children to achieve their full potential.</p> <p>The school will follow the guidelines in the policy, and will be available to discuss individual needs and circumstances.</p>	<p>Parents are encouraged to support their child with their homework. Specific guidelines are laid out in the Homework Policy.</p>
<b>Topic Work</b>	<p>The school will inform parents of forthcoming areas of study.</p>	<p>Parents are encouraged to follow up the topics being undertaken in the school.</p>
<b>Information Exchange</b>	<p>The school is required to obtain personal and medical information about children.</p> <p>The school is committed to providing:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• An individual pupil profile on academic, personal, and social progress of each child, annually; the school will provide opportunities to discuss this report</li> <li>• A parental interview, by invitation, or a regular update on progress</li> <li>• An open afternoon in the Summer term</li> </ul> <p>The school will endeavour to meet parents' needs, and meet with parents at mutually convenient times.</p>	<p>Parents are asked to provide any information that they feel may affect a child's behaviour and performance at school, including individual worries and concerns, and specific information on health, welfare, and family circumstances.</p> <p>Parents are required to complete the standard confidential form for children's personal and medical information as fully as possible, and to inform the school of any changes.</p> <p>The school would appreciate comments from parents on annual pupil profile reports.</p> <p>Parents are encouraged to share their concerns with the school.</p>
